

FEEDING CHECKLIST

ABOUT THE PARENT

- □ I get severe nipple or breast pain when my baby latches, sometimes even throughout the feed.
- It can feel as if my baby is chewing or chomping down on my nipples while breastfeeding and sometimes when my baby unlatches, my nipples look blanched or compressed.
- ☐ My nipples are so cracked and sore. Sometimes they might even bleed.
- ☐ My breasts don't feel completely drained when my baby finishes their feed.
- □ I have experienced plugged ducts or even mastitis since starting breastfeeding.

ABOUTBABY

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- □ I would characterize my baby as being very "colicky" and "refluxy".
- ☐ My baby isn't gaining weight very easily and I am worried about failure to thrive.
- ☐ My baby seems to have difficulty achieving and maintaining a good latch while breastfeeding.
- ☐ My baby never seems satisfied after a feed. He either keeps rooting, brings hands to his mouth, or sometimes even takes a pacifier to help him settle.
- ☐ Milk leaks or spills out the side of my baby's mouth while feeding.
- □ After a feed, you can see some milk residue on my baby's tongue. Not at the tip, but further back.
- □ I often hear a clicking sound while my baby is breastfeeding.
- ☐ My baby always has a little blister or callus on their upper lip.
- ☐ My baby's upper lip folds under when latched.
- ☐ My baby takes forever to complete a feed, and it seems like as soon as we finish one, he's needing to feed again.
- ☐ My baby is very fussy at the breast. They often push, pull, and/or tug while latched. At times I can tell they're hungry but they refuse to latch.
